Delays with the project, due to converting a private dwelling into a property more suitable for public facing activities; Kings Oak School have done the upgrade work (doors, carpet, decoration, fire safety, asbestos, new fencing etc) KTC has funded £10,000, with Kings Oak, SGC and the Reach Foundation funding the remainder £40,000. Above new staff will be based in the Hub once a week, KTC staff will attend once a week, and arrangements are being made now for service delivery: breastfeeding clinic, parenting support, school nurse sessions, mental wellbeing sessions, signpost drop in sessions being arranged. Soft launch will be organised in Spring by KTC. Case Studies: Town Clerk has been invited to talk about this project in Kingswood to representatives from Telford and Wrekin Councils, with officers from SGC, Thornbury Town Council and Patchway Town Council: National Youth Agency has recognised that our approach is pioneering and is using the model as a case study for others to make enquiries about.
